

# Frequently Asked Questions

## E-Learning

### **1. What is an E-Learning Day?**

Public Act 101-0012 allows school districts statewide to utilize e-Learning days in lieu of emergency days and maintains flexibility for students to engage in learning outside of the classroom.

### **2. What technology platform does the school district use to communicate with students?**

The school district will use School Messenger, the district website, and it's Facebook page to communicate information with parents and the community. Teachers will have communicated with students and parents on how they will communicate daily assignments.

### **3. What technology is needed by the student to complete his or her assignments?**

This will vary by grade-level and subject. It is important to note that teachers will also provide non-electronic assignments to a student that does not have access to a device or an internet connection.

### **4. How is attendance taken during an E-Learning Day?**

Through the school district's school messenger service an email and text will be sent daily to parents. The text and email will contain a link to a form that parents will complete to mark their student(s) present or absent. Students should only be marked absent if they are not able to do the E-Learning assignments that day due to an illness.

### **5. How do students without access to tech devices and/or internet participate?**

Teachers will provide non-electronic assignments to students without access to tech devices and/or the internet prior to E-Learning days.

### **6. How do E-Learning Days impact students with disabilities?**

Teachers will work to continue to provide accommodations and/or modifications as outlined in a student's individualized education plan (IEP).

**7. How are extracurricular activities impacted during an E-Learning Day?**

There will be NO extracurricular activities during an E-Learning Day.

**8. What are teachers' requirements during an E-Learning Day?**

Teachers will continue to plan assignments and check student work and progress. Additionally, they will post the daily E-Learning assignment by 8:30 AM each day. Finally, they will be available from 8:30 AM to 1:30 PM to help students and respond to questions via their school email and any other platform the teacher has identified to students and parents.

**9. Will lunches be provided during an E-Learning Day?**

The school district currently plans to provide “grab and go” lunches that can be picked up at any one of our four school locations from 11:30 am -1:00 pm. *(HIS will pick-up lunches at HHS).* Below are links that provide directions the location of each school.

**10. How much time will students have to complete his/her assignments?**

Assignments completion will vary by task and teacher. At the minimum, a student will have at least 24 hours to complete his/her assignment.

Teachers will be available from 8:30 AM to 1:30 PM to help students and respond to questions via their school email and any other platform the teacher has identified to students and parents.
